STUDENT EMPLOYMENT PROCEDURE

Each department that hires a student is responsible for ensuring that the required employment paperwork is accurately completed and forwarded to the Payroll Office. This paperwork consists of a Student Employment Form, the Payroll Election form, a federal W-4 form, a state W-4 form, and an I-9 form.

Once an offer of a paid position has been made and accepted, the department supervisor should verify that the student has completed the necessary employment paperwork. This must be completed before the student begins working.

Federal and state W-4 forms must be completed, signed and dated by the student. Please note, the student cannot claim exemptions on the W-4 forms and then claim “exempt”. This invalidates the form. They must claim either a number of exemptions or exempt (only if they meet the requirements for exempt) but not both.

The I-9 form requires completion by both the student and the supervisor. The student must complete the top portion of the form (Section 1) and sign and date it no later than the first date of employment. The supervisor (an Alma college employee) must then complete Section 2 within 3 business days of employment. This consists of actually looking at and verifying the student’s required identification. This would include either one item from List A OR one item from List B AND one item from List C. The acceptable forms of identification are listed on the back of the I-9 form. Only original documents are acceptable – no photo copies or faxed copies. The supervisor must then enter the employment date and sign in the Certification section of the I-9 form.

The completed packet is then immediately forwarded to the Payroll Office located in the lower level of Hamilton.

STUDENT PAYROLL INSTRUCTIONS

If you are a student who has been hired for a job on campus there are a few things you need to know before getting paid.

You need to complete the necessary new hire paperwork. Complete a Federal and State form W-4, the payroll direct deposit form, and an I-9 form. Please fill out the forms using your full legal name and your home address, as this is where the W-2's will be sent in January. The federal I-9 form requires you to provide identification for your supervisor to see and record information from (most often students bring their driver license and social security card, but other forms of identification are listed on the form as to what is acceptable identification). **Original identification documents are required, no copies will be accepted. Please plan ahead if you need to send home for documents because this form needs to be completed on or BEFORE the first day you begin work.**

1. Meet with your supervisor to find out if you or they will be tracking your hours and recording them on an Alma College timesheet. Timesheets are for two weeks and are paid every other Friday. Timesheets must be completed and turned in to your supervisor immediately after your last working day of the pay period. Please make sure the form is completed properly and that you and your supervisor have signed the time sheet, as an incomplete form will slow down processing time. Instructions on how to complete a timesheet are listed right on the front of the timesheet. **Any time sheet received late by Payroll will NOT BE PAID until the following pay period.**
2. Direct deposit or signing up for a payroll debit card is required. This form is attached and is also available online from the Alma College Financial Services webpage at <http://www.alma.edu/offices/financial-services/for-faculty-staff/>. Payroll advices are accessible from the portal under My Services – Employee Profile – Pay Advices. In addition, if desired, a payroll deduction can be made to apply money directly to your Alma College receivable account. Please complete the attached Student Payroll Deduction form only if you wish to enroll in this deduction.
3. W-2's will be available in January. Please remember to give us updated home addresses if you move.
4. Students' work schedules are not to exceed 20 hours per week, per Federal Government regulations. During the summer, or other break periods, students may work up to 40 hours per week. Student employees are not allowed by Alma College policy to work over 40 hours per week for Alma College.

Form W-4 (2017)

Purpose. Complete Form W-4 so that your employer can withhold the correct federal income tax from your pay. Consider completing a new Form W-4 each year and when your personal or financial situation changes.

Exemption from withholding. If you are exempt, complete **only** lines 1, 2, 3, 4, and 7 and sign the form to validate it. Your exemption for 2017 expires February 15, 2018. See Pub. 505, Tax Withholding and Estimated Tax.

Note: If another person can claim you as a dependent on his or her tax return, you can't claim exemption from withholding if your total income exceeds \$1,050 and includes more than \$350 of unearned income (for example, interest and dividends).

Exceptions. An employee may be able to claim exemption from withholding even if the employee is a dependent, if the employee:

- Is age 65 or older,
- Is blind, or
- Will claim adjustments to income; tax credits; or itemized deductions, on his or her tax return.

The exceptions don't apply to supplemental wages greater than \$1,000,000.

Basic instructions. If you aren't exempt, complete the **Personal Allowances Worksheet** below. The worksheets on page 2 further adjust your withholding allowances based on itemized deductions, certain credits, adjustments to income, or two-earners/multiple jobs situations.

Complete all worksheets that apply. However, you may claim fewer (or zero) allowances. For regular wages, withholding must be based on allowances you claimed and may not be a flat amount or percentage of wages.

Head of household. Generally, you can claim head of household filing status on your tax return only if you are unmarried and pay more than 50% of the costs of keeping up a home for yourself and your dependent(s) or other qualifying individuals. See Pub. 501, Exemptions, Standard Deduction, and Filing Information, for information.

Tax credits. You can take projected tax credits into account in figuring your allowable number of withholding allowances. Credits for child or dependent care expenses and the child tax credit may be claimed using the **Personal Allowances Worksheet** below. See Pub. 505 for information on converting your other credits into withholding allowances.

Nonwage income. If you have a large amount of nonwage income, such as interest or dividends, consider making estimated tax payments using Form 1040-ES, Estimated Tax for Individuals. Otherwise, you may owe additional tax. If you have pension or annuity income, see Pub. 505 to find out if you should adjust your withholding on Form W-4 or W-4P.

Two earners or multiple jobs. If you have a working spouse or more than one job, figure the total number of allowances you are entitled to claim on all jobs using worksheets from only one Form W-4. Your withholding usually will be most accurate when all allowances are claimed on the Form W-4 for the highest paying job and zero allowances are claimed on the others. See Pub. 505 for details.

Nonresident alien. If you are a nonresident alien, see Notice 1392, Supplemental Form W-4 Instructions for Nonresident Aliens, before completing this form.

Check your withholding. After your Form W-4 takes effect, use Pub. 505 to see how the amount you are having withheld compares to your projected total tax for 2017. See Pub. 505, especially if your earnings exceed \$130,000 (Single) or \$180,000 (Married).

Future developments. Information about any future developments affecting Form W-4 (such as legislation enacted after we release it) will be posted at www.irs.gov/w4.

INSTRUCTIONS TO EMPLOYEE

You must submit a Michigan withholding exemption certificate (form MI-W4) to your employer on or before the date that employment begins. If you fail or refuse to submit this certificate, your employer must withhold tax from your compensation without allowance for any exemptions. Your employer is required to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury if you have claimed 10 or more personal and dependent exemptions or claimed a status which exempts you from withholding.

You MUST file a new MI-W4 within 10 days if your residency status changes or if your exemptions decrease because: a) your spouse, for whom you have been claiming an exemption, is divorced or legally separated from you or claims his/her own exemption(s) on a separate certificate, or b) a dependent must be dropped for federal purposes.

Line 5: If you check "Yes," enter your date of hire (mo/day/year).

Line 6: Personal and dependent exemptions. The total number of exemptions you claim on the MI-W4 may not exceed the number of exemptions you are entitled to claim when you file your Michigan individual income tax return.

If you are married and you and your spouse are both employed, you both may not claim the same exemptions with each of your employers.

If you hold more than one job, you may not claim the same exemptions with more than one employer. If you claim the same exemptions at more than one job, your tax will be under withheld.

Line 7: You may designate additional withholding if you expect to owe more than the amount withheld.

Line 8: You may claim exemption from Michigan income tax withholding ONLY if you do not anticipate a Michigan income tax liability for the current year because all of the following exist: a) your employment is less than full time, b) your personal and dependent exemption allowance exceeds your annual compensation, c) you claimed exemption from federal withholding, d) you did not incur a Michigan income tax liability for the previous year. You may also claim exemption if your permanent home (domicile) is located in a Renaissance Zone or you are a non-resident spouse of military personnel stationed in Michigan. Members of flow-through entities may not claim exemption from nonresident flow-through withholding. For more information on Renaissance Zones call (517) 636-4486. Full-time students that do not satisfy all of the above requirements cannot claim exempt status.
