

How to be a Good Neighbor in the Kitchen...

1. Be considerate of others. We all get in a hurry, but please clean up your own messes.
2. Only food related items should be in the kitchen - not books, clothing, etc.
3. Cover food when microwaving – if it spills or splatters, please clean it up.
4. Clean up after yourself (including dishes, microwave, stove, oven, countertops, & floor).
5. If you use the table and chairs, make sure they are clean when you are finished (Sweep under your chair or wipe up the tabletop if you spill).
6. Wash and take care of all dishes you used (including pans), and take them back to your room when finished.
Any dishes left out will be thrown away.

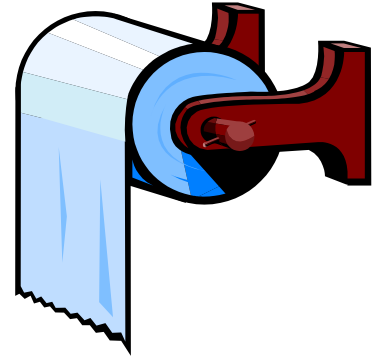


- Please clean up after yourself. It's important for each member of the community to be respectful and play their part in being a good neighbor.

How to be a Good Neighbor in the Bathroom...

1. Flush. Always!



2. Clean up any messes.

3. Replace toilet paper if necessary
(storage closets contain more).

4. Wash your hands. Always!

How to be a Good Neighbor in the Laundry...

1. Keep it clean & courteous.
 2. Clean the lint trap before & after using a dryer.
 3. Remove used fabric-softener sheets and throw them away.
 4. Wet clothes go inside dryers, not on top (Use the golden rule here: You wouldn't want your clean clothes lounging atop a dirty table, or even worse, on the floor).
 5. Keep track of the time your laundry will be done. Stay near-by or return at that time to avoid missing or moved clothing.
