Alma College Graduates' Educator Effectiveness Scores for 2018-2019 from the MDE

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) requires all public school teachers in their first three years of experience to be evaluated and rated with an Educator Effectiveness rating.* This rating is based on a combination of factors which must include classroom observations and P-12 student growth demonstrated on statewide assessments. For the 2018-2019 ratings, 25% of teacher evaluations (on which these effectiveness scores were based) was based on student growth and assessment data.
