

ASSESSING CAMPUS CLIMATE Nick Piccolo, Vice President for Student Life/ Title IX Coordinator

Introduction


Over the past two years, the college has taken several steps to address concerns related to sexual harassment and misconduct. Developing a campus-wide response to safety concerns begins with assessing the current environment and understanding the issues. In the winter term of 2015, the college invited students to participate in the first Higher Education Data Sharing Consortium (HEDS) Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey. The survey was administered again in winter 2016.

Although there are other national surveys focusing upon these issues, the college determined that the HEDS survey most effectively met the needs of the campus. Several of the member schools within the HEDS consortium are small private liberal arts colleges similar to Alma, allowing us to compare our students' responses to those of their peers at other schools. While each school is unique, concerns related to campus climate and sexual assault are found on every campus. Comparing our outcomes to those of peer institutions adds context and perspective to these important issues. Also, because of our membership in HEDS, we were able to participate with representatives from other colleges in the development of the questions for the survey and to suggest inclusion of questions about concerns that had been raised on our campus.

For both years of the survey administration, all students, except for dually-enrolled high school students, received an email invitation to participate, followed by two reminder emails. In addition, students were encouraged to participate through a poster campaign and notices in the Almanian student newspaper. Participation was voluntary and confidential. The students' responses were submitted directly to HEDS and the college received a summary of the results.

Survey Participation

The 25.7% response rate in 2016 was lower than the 38.9% response rate in 2015, although the representation across the four classes was consistent:



In both survey years, the majority of respondents were women (68.1% in 2015 and 71.3% in 2016), lived on campus (77% and 79.4%), listed their race as white (87.3% and 85.1%) and their sexual orientation as heterosexual (79.3% and 80.5%).

At the end of this report, we have included a comprehensive data set detailing the 2015 and 2016 results and offering comparisons between Alma students' responses and those of their peers at other institutions. However, to assist readers in understanding the outcomes, selected survey responses that may offer context are included on the following pages.

Please note that given the college's small enrollment, to protect the identity of respondents and provide larger samples for analysis of differences between majority and minority groups, in the data sets at the end of this report, we grouped responses related to race and sexual orientation into White or Non-White and Heterosexual or Non-Heterosexual.

Feedback about Campus Climate

Most respondents agreed with the statement "Faculty, staff and administrators are genuinely concerned about students' welfare", reflecting the caring community that the college strives to be.

However, respondents were not as positive in their response to the statement "If a crisis happened here, I am confident that campus officials would handle it well."

This is a disappointing response. The college seeks to instill confidence in our students that critical incidents will be handled effectively. Therefore, this concern has been identified as an area for further study and improvement. In other areas of concern, students who did not identify as heterosexual viewed the campus climate less positively than their heterosexual peers and survey responses indicate that the college needs to provide more resources and support to women. These concerns will also be targeted for improvement.

Frequencies of Unwanted Sexual Contact

The survey asked several questions about unwanted sexual contact including unwanted nonverbal behaviors such as lewd gestures or sexual texts, unwanted verbal behaviors including sexual comments about a person's body or sexual advances, and unwanted physical contact such as brief inappropriate touching. The responses of Alma students are detailed in the data provided at the end of this summary.

In response to questions about sexual assault, there was an increase from 2015 to 2016 in the percentage of respondents who reported experiencing sexual assault at some time during their college years, both at Alma and at other small colleges.

Despite the college's efforts to increase awareness and ease of reporting, there was virtually no change in the percentage of students who used the college's procedures to report the sexual assault (16.7% in 2015 as compared to 16% in 2016). These percentages are consistent with the responses of peers at other small colleges. Most respondents told a close friend (70%) or roommate (40%), but a significant percentage (16.7%) did not tell anyone. When asked why they didn't report the assault, the most frequently listed reason at Alma as well as at peer institutions was "I was ashamed/embarrassed", "I thought I would be blamed for what happened" or "I did not think I would be believed." (Again, respondents could select more than one reason.)

These reasons are also consistent with those given by survivors of sexual assault nationally, whether they are college students or not. There are many reasons that someone might decide not to report. Survivors suffer a significant degree of physical and emotional trauma during, immediately following, and in some instances, for a considerable length of time after an assault. Sometimes reactions can be delayed for months or even years and the recovery process will be different for each individual.

Results of the College's Prevention, Education and Training Initiatives

The college recognizes that increasing knowledge and providing skills to respond appropriately are important tools in reducing incidents of sexual misconduct. We have instituted several programs that focus on teaching students to identify and respond to sexual misconduct and to take action, intervene and help. The survey responses in 2016 indicate that significantly more students had received information or education about what constitutes sexual assault (80.5% in 2016 compared to 75.3% in 2015), how to report an incident (65.3% compared to 52.9%), and what they could do as a bystander to prevent sexual assault (75.9% as compared to 65%). In 2016, 33 of the surveyed students reported observing an incident that they believed could be sexual assault and a significant percentage of them (78.9%) reported actively intervening. While these results are promising, we will seek to improve individual and community awareness and will continue to offer training to influence bystander behaviors and combat biases and harmful attitudes.

Next Steps

The college will maintain and prioritize practices that may reduce the frequency of assault including strong policies and enforcement, campus modifications (lighting, cameras, limiting access to residence halls), prevention, education and training initiatives for students, faculty and staff, and open dialogue about how to improve the campus climate. Supplementing the information provided in the HEDS survey with campus conversations and focus groups, a small working group consisting of faculty, staff and students will draft an action plan to address the identified concerns. The Campus Safety Committee and the Strategy and Planning Council will review the plan to offer feedback to the task force and the proposed action plan will then be submitted it to the Executive Staff for approval.
