

Alma College Financial Aid Programs 2022 - 2023

These programs including eligibility, amounts, and renewal information are effective for students who will start attending at Alma College during FA2022, WI2023, or SP2023. These are subject to change with appropriate notice.

MERIT AWARDS

Alma merit scholarships are based upon the students' GPA. The amount awarded as a freshman is the amount renewed annually.

Distinguished Presidential Scholarship – Full Tuition*

This award covers the tuition cost only of 2 spring terms. Think Critically Venture funding is capped at \$1,000.

Renewal Requirements for Distinguished Presidential Scholarship (full tuition)

- 1. Be enrolled full time 13-18 credits. Additional credit cost over 18 is not covered.
- 2. Live on campus. (student's approved to move off campus would lose the scholarship)
- 3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP) https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/#acadprogress
- 4. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 5. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 6. You must file the FAFSA every year prior to March 1st.

Distinguished Presidential Scholarship - \$34,000 - NOT FULL TUITION

This award follows the merit award scholarship renewal criteria below. The amount awarded as a freshman is the amount renewed annually. Cannot be combined with other standard Alma College aid.

Merit Award Scholarship Renewal

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeking student.
- 2. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 3. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 4. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
- 5. The scholarship renews at the originally awarded amount <u>unless</u> you are not living on campus and/or are not on a meal plan. Please refer to the policy regarding off campus aid adjustments at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.

^{**} Freshman earning the Presidential, Dean's, or Tartan Scholarships are invited to attend Scholars Summit, where they will interview for additional scholarship funds. Transfer students with a college GPA of 3.0 or higher will also be invited to interview on an individual basis.

^{*} Full tuition is covered using Alma College, State, and Federal aid sources.

PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Performance scholarships are available to talented students in art, dance, music (both vocal and instrumental), theatre, and Scottish Arts. Students demonstrating exemplary performance in any of these areas may be eligible for distinguished awards, earning up to full tuition. All funds are awarded at the discretion of the fine and performing arts faculty, and students' intended major or minor is not a consideration. The amount awarded as a freshman will follow the student to future years. Students interested in auditioning can contact the Admissions Office at admissions@alma.edu or 1-800-321-ALMA.

Students are only eligible to receive <u>one scholarship</u> per year in the performance scholarships. If students are offered an award from more than one department, they must select one. Students may continue to participate in multiple areas regardless of their scholarship selection. If offered a distinguished award it will replace standard performance awards previously offered. Art and Design

\$1,500/year. The Department of Art & Design awards scholarships to talented artists in any medium via portfolio submission.

Dance

\$1,500/year. The Dance Department awards scholarships to talented dancers through a group or individual audition process.

Dance Team

\$1,500/year. Awarded upon acceptance to incoming students (first year & transfer) who compete on the dance team. Interested students should complete the

Music

\$1,500/year. The Music Department awards scholarships both instrumentalists and vocalists through an audition process. Auditions are scheduled on an individual basis; for details, see the department's audition and scholarship information.

Theatre

\$1,500/year. The Theatre Department awards acting scholarships through an audition process and technical theatre scholarships via portfolio submission. Auditions are scheduled on an individual basis.

Scottish Arts Scholarship

\$1,500/year. For students demonstrating a high level of accomplishment in Highland dancing or piping (regardless of intended major).

E-Sports Scholarship

\$1,500/year. Awarded upon acceptance to incoming students (first year and transfer) who compete on the E-sports team.

Performance Scholarship Renewal

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeing student.
- 2. A student must be meeting the requirements of the department for which they hold a scholarship (class registration, participation, etc.). Rosters are sent to departments in February and September to confirm requirements are met for renewal.
- 3. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 4. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 5. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
- 6. The scholarship renews at the originally awarded amount.

OTHER ALMA SCHOLARSHIPS

Available for students meeting specific criteria or those interested in specific areas of study. Please note that some of these scholarships are automatically awarded based on set criteria, while others require an application and have a deadline. Many of these are only awarded to incoming freshman and transfer students. Most of these awards are renewable in future years if all scholarship, award, or grant requirements are still being met.

Legacy (alumni award) / Referral Award \$1,500/year

Students who attend Alma and are referred to Alma College by an alumnus, faculty, staff member, current student or friend of the college receive the Alma College Referral Award. To be eligible, students can be referred at any time prior to their acceptance to the college.

Awarded based on information collected on the Alma College admissions application.

*Please note, parental referrals of their own student cannot qualify for the Referral Award. However, students with qualifying alumni legacy connections will qualify for the Alumni Award.

Inclusive Excellence Award

\$4,000/year

- For members of underrepresented backgrounds including members of the LGBTQIA+community.
 Students are automatically considered for the award upon acceptance. Students who are members of LGBTQIA+ community <u>MUST</u> self-disclose to their admissions representative upon acceptance to the college to be eligible.
- Awarded based on information collected on the Alma College admissions application.

Religious Leadership Scholarships

\$1,500/year

Separate Application Required

Awarded to a limited number of students who excel in spiritual and /or interfaith leadership, creativity, and service. Students may receive either the Spiritual Live Award or the Interfaith Leadership Award. Students may apply for each but are only eligible for one award.

Spiritual Life Award

This award is given to incoming Alma College students of all faith backgrounds who demonstrate prior leadership in their religious life through, but not limited to, youth group activities, service and mission, worship/liturgical leadership, or active participation in one's community of faith.

Interfaith Leadership Award

Students selected for this award share commitment and compassion for community building that acknowledges faith-seeking understanding between neighbors on and off campus. Award is granted to incoming first year students who demonstrate a commitment to interfaith dialogue, service and education at Alma College. Student are expected to participate in Interfaith events at Alma College and provide support to the Interfaith Student Ministry Coordinators during the Thursday Interfaith Connections talks, Interfaith Chapel House events, and creative outlets for educating the whole community about religious intersectionality between students, staff, faculty, alumni, and community partners.

Renewal Requirements for Religious Leadership scholarships (in addition to "Other Alma Scholarship Renewal Requirements below)

- 1. Participate in either the Spiritual Life Leadership Cohort or the Interfaith Leadership Cohort.
- 2. Convene in the group at least twice each semester to advise, support and guide the Chaplain and Chapel staff for programming, events, and religious life clubs and activities.

Heritage Need Based Grant

Amount varies - based on need *

* Amount can change each academic year as it is based on need and a FAFSA must be filed to qualify.

Awarded to students with demonstrated financial need. If a student's need decreases substantially in future years they may no longer be eligible for the award or it may be a reduced amount. If a student's need increases the financial aid office will recalculate and may increase or add a grant based on this change.

Renewal Requirements for Heritage Need Based Grant

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeking student.
- 2. A student must have need (based on FAFSA).
- 3. Must file the FAFSA annually.
- 4. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 5. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 6. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
- 7. The scholarship renews at the originally awarded amount as long as a student still has need based on the current year FAFSA.

Upward Bound Scholarship

\$2,000/year

For students with at least three years of participation in Upward Bound or Upward Bound Math-Science programs. Applicants must provide a letter from program director confirming involvement by February 1, 2020.

Future Teacher Scholarship

\$1,500/year

Awarded to applicants with preference giving to students who intend to pursue teacher certification in a shortage area or are members of underrepresented groups in the current teaching workforce.

Scottish Hospitality Scholarship

\$1,000/year

For students who completed an individual visit to Alma College between March 1 of your junior year and August 1 before enrolling.

S-STEM Scholarship

up to \$5,000/year

Separate Application Required

Alma College offers a limited number of STEM scholarships to incoming students. The awards, of up to \$5,000 per year, are available for students majoring in STEM fields (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics). Majors eligible for the scholarship include Biochemistry, Biology, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Environmental Science, Integrative Physiology and Health Science, Mathematics, and Physics. Deadlines: To be considered for the scholarship, complete the scholarship application by December 1, 2020 and submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid by December 1, 2020.

Other Alma Scholarships Renewal * (Section Does Not Apply to Heritage Need Based Grant)

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeking student.
- 2. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 3. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 4. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
- 5. The scholarship renews at the originally awarded amount.

GEOGRAPHIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Chicago-Area Scholarship

\$3,000/year

Chicago-Area Scholarship: Supported by alumni and friends and available to students from Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will counties in Illinois. This competitive award is based on GPA. Students are considered for eligibility upon acceptance to Alma.

Detroit Futures Scholarship

Amount varies - based on need *

Alma College offers up to 15 Detroit Future Scholarships each year to qualified students from select schools in the city of Detroit. The Detroit Future Scholarship assists substantially with financial need making a private education affordable with minimal out-of-pocket expense. Scholarship amount varies depending on financial need — Alma College will maximize the dollar amount you can receive.

Alma College Community Engagement (ACE) Scholarship full tuition * Separate Application Required

The Alma College Community Engagement (ACE) Scholarship program was created to offer Gratiot, Isabella, and Montcalm County's most engaged students the opportunity to pursue a life-changing, liberal arts education. The program will offer up to 13 four-year, full-tuition scholarships annually to graduating high school seniors who demonstrate financial need. This award covers the tuition cost only of 2 spring terms. Think Critically Venture funding is capped at \$1,000.

This scholarship requires additional steps for application. Selection criteria:

- Must reside in Gratiot County or be a graduate of a high school in Gratiot County.
- Primary criteria will be community engagement and financial need. Secondary criteria will be letters of support, campus interview, application essay and academic record.

Renewal Requirements for ACE

- 1. Be enrolled full time 13-18 credits. Additional credit cost over 18 is not covered.
- 2. Live on campus. (student's approved to move off campus would lose the ACE scholarship)
- 3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP) https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/#acadprogress
- 4. File the FAFSA annually before March 1st.
- 5. Meet all engagement requirements in year 1, 2, 3, and 4 These are located on the website at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/grants-scholarships/alma-scholarships/geo-scholarships/alma-college-community-engagement-scholarship/.

Geographic Scholarships Renewal * (Section Does Not Apply to ACE)

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeking student.
- 2. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 3. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.

- 4. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
- 5. The scholarship renews at the originally awarded amount <u>except for Detroit Futures and promise</u> <u>programs as tuition changes affect the amount of these awards</u>.

TRANSFER SPECIFIC STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS / GRANTS / AWARDS

Merit Scholarship

Alma merit scholarships are based upon the students' cumulative GPA from all previous institutions attended. The amount awarded upon acceptance to the college is the amount renewed annually.

Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship

\$2,000/year

Awarded to transfer students who have been selected as Phi Theta Kappa Scholars at their current institutions. Students must submit their Phi Theta Kappa membership certificate to receive the award.

Community College Connection

\$2,000/year

Awarded to transfer students from community colleges in Michigan. Students must be directly transferring from a community college to qualify.

Transfer Specific Scholarship/grant/awards Renewal

- 1. A student must be enrolled full time (12 credits or more) each semester as a degree seeking student.
- 2. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 3. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 4. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.

INTERNATIONAL SPECIFIC STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS / GRANTS / AWARDS

Merit Scholarship

Consideration for academic scholarships, which range up to \$24,000 per year (winter 2019 and later), are based on documentation provided as a part of the application process. Grade point averages are converted to a U.S. 4.0 scale. The amount awarded upon acceptance to the college is the amount renewed annually.

- 2. This award is renewable for three years (6 semester's total) or to the point where the student has completed degree requirements for their first bachelor's degree; whichever comes first. Undergraduate students who graduate in less than 8 semesters forfeit their remaining scholarship eligibility.
- 3. The annual amount above is split in half between fall and winter semesters.
- 4. Students must maintain the minimum GPA requirements found in the satisfactory academic progress policy found at https://www.alma.edu/admissions/financial-aid/policies/.
