Social Sciences (6-cr)

Foundational Civics – Political Science (POL) or History (HIS) from approved list that will come to Alma College as a direct match in POL or HST, will satisfy the Self and Society Explore Category of General Education. Note: POL 105W and HIS 237W will satisfy the Foundational Civics and Civic Engagement graduation requirement.

POL: POL-212W, 215W, 220W, 221W*, 223W, 225W, 228W*, 229W, 232W, 241W (Suggested to take 200-level)

*It is recommended to complete POL-228W Civil Rights and Liberties or POL-221 Comparative Government in order to satisfy the Explore: JEDI theme.

OR

HIS: 215W, 217W, 221W, 222W, 225W, 237W*, 240HW, 240W, 242W (suggested to take 200-level) *It is recommended to complete HIS-237 History of Michigan at Delta to satisfy this requirement, this course is a direct match to the Alma College HST-206 Approaches to Michigan History, and complete a theme course.

Additional Social Science Electives from approved list: SOC 211HW, 211W, 212W, 215W*, 221W, 230HW*, 230W*, 231*, 233, 265, 288, 289? Recommended selections to satisfy the Global Cultural Awareness Badge

Natural Science (8-cr)

Complete two courses in this area, must be from two different disciplines:

Complete any science with a laboratory from AST, BIO, CHM, GEO, PHY, PSC or SCI to satisfy the Science Explore content area of the gen ed.

Mathematics (4-cr)

Complete any MTH, approved Mathematics course from approved list, must be completed at the 119 or higher level to be considered "college level" at Alma College. Additional MTH course may be needed to satisfy a prereq for the accepted level course. Students may also demonstrate proficiency in college-level mathematics or earn a score of 275 on the Accuplacer exam.

Lifelong Wellness (2 cr)

Complete any approved Lifelong Wellness course (2-cr) – will transfer to Alma as an elective toward graduation

Any LW (1 credit) and LWA (1 credit) or any LW (2 credits) or LW 206A, LWA 206B, or LWA 206C (2 credits for occupational programs), or LWT 210, LWT 230, LWT 240, LWT 242, or LWT 251 (3-4 credits)

TOTAL = 32 credits in AA program requirements
