Explore Courses: students will complete four courses, one in each theme area to satisfy the Explore area of Gen Ed. Arts: MUS 275 Music Appreciation (3)

JEDI (Justice, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion): HUM 253 American Culture (3)

Science: BIO 103 Concepts of Genetics & Biotech (3) or GEL 101 Physical Geology (4)

Self & Society: PSY 101 Introduction to General Psychology (3) and PHL 102 Issues in Philosophy (3)

Theme Courses: students will complete three courses in one theme, many themes are available to choose.

Completed At Alma College – Remaining General Education

(WI) Writing Intensive Course: All students will complete a minimum of four credits of 200- or 300-level writing intensive coursework that focuses on writing and research within a discipline.

(IDS) Interdisciplinary Seminar: All students will take four credits of an Interdisciplinary Seminar in their third or fourth year.

(QR) Quantitative Reasoning: All students will take four credits of a course designated course as quantitative reasoning.

Residency Requirement

52-credits must be completed at Alma College to satisfy requirements to earn a bachelor's degree. This can be accomplished with three terms (16-cr each) and 1-Spring Term (4-cr).

Psychology major at Alma: PSY 120; 201 or 203 or 204; 212 or 276 or 336; 220; 225; 305 or 308 or 310; 314; 331; 421; 2 elective credits in psychology.

After Completion of two years at Mid, students will complete the following at Alma College to conclude the major: PSY 201 or 203 or 204; 220; 225; 305 or 308 or 310; 421.
